### **New Student Swim Tests**

A swim test is required for all new students ages 8 and above. New students should bring a towel to their first day of sailing school, as the test will take place at the end of their class.

## Weather Appropriate Gear for Sailing School

The weather in Stage Harbor can change quickly and it is very important that students arrive to sailing school prepared for varied conditions. The following gear is <u>required</u> for all sailing school students. Please make sure everything is clearly labeled with your child's name and please make sure you do not leave gear at the Club:

- A Coast Guard approved and properly fitted lifejacket (PDF) with a whistle attached
- Close toed shoes. Flip-flops are not allowed in the boat.
- Appropriate sun protection: hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen
- Non-cotton, breathable outerwear
